Entries must be postmarked by January 7. Note – shipping is at your own risk.

Pick Up

Items may be picked up at the Lewistown Art Center during regular Art Center hours the week of March 1. Prompt retrieval is appreciated out of respect for the Art Center's space. If you would like your quilt returned to you by mail (at your own risk), please include the cost of shipping with your entry form.

Awards

- People's Choice voting will be conducted during Montana Winter Fair, winner will receive a rosette and prize.
- Top Five fellow quilter's recognition as voted by the Central Montana Quilt Zoo (an informal gathering of like-minded people - the kind that like to cut fabric up and sew it back together!). All quilters are invited to stop and cast your peer vote prior to Thursday, February 3. They will be awarded at the Gallery Reception February 4.

Rules

1. Changing things up a bit this year. The Winter Fair Quilt Show will be a show only, no judging.
2. This show is not juried and is open to any person, any age, amateur or professional.
3. Quilts entered in previous Montana Winter Fair Quilt Shows are not eligible.
4. Quantity of entries from each exhibitor is not limited. If display MUST be limited due to space, priority will go to displaying equal entries for each person.
5. Special designation will be given for youth entries as well as antique and vintage quilts.
6. An eligible quilt entry must consist of three layers (top, batting and backing) and be hand or machine quilted, or tied. Exceptions to the three-layer construction may include clothing, yo-yos, ragtime, chenille, summer weight quilts, cathedral windows or art quilts.

7. A fabric label with name of entrant should be sewn or securely safety pinned on the back of the quilt to serve as permanent identification.
8. Use the official entry form available at MontanaWinterFair.com. Only one quilt per form, which must accompany quilt(s) to be entered. This form will be displayed with your quilt.
9. Be generous with your entry form descriptions! Our viewers all like to know the bit of extra and why it's special. Look at the perspective of fellow quilters as well as those that are admiring our art for the first time. Techniques may include Y seams, applique, hand piecing, curved piecing, etc. Give details about how/where you found the pattern, what you really love about the piece, who the special recipient is, etc.
10. Diligence will be taken to assure safety and care of articles after their acceptance and placement. In no case will Montana Winter Fair and/or its representatives be responsible for loss or damage. Safety may preclude articles being displayed to their best advantage.
11. Exhibits not complying with rules will not be eligible. Submission of quilts will imply acceptance of all rules. Superintendent reserves the right to reject an entry deemed unworthy or in bad taste.
12. Superintendent and Art Center Director have the final decision in displaying of quilts.

Selling Quilted Items

This is a great opportunity to offer some of your quilted art for sale to a great audience! From large quilts to small wall hangings, mug rugs or other quilted items, people will love to shop at our incredible show. Items for sale will be clearly marked. Additionally, this is how our quilt community may return our gratitude for the generosity of the Art Center in housing our amazing display.

We are the only show the Art Center hosts that has not previously had the opportunity to sell items, thus supporting the non-profit Art Center. You set the price for your pieces and keep 60% of the sale, 40% goes to the Art Center for electricity, heating, staffing, education and all the amazing art and cultural programs they bring to our community. Additionally, you are encouraged to be an Art Center member.
